The Medication Nursing Assistant Program prepares LNAs to function as trusted care partners of the Registered Nursing and Licensed Practical Nurses in administering medications to stable clients in long term care facilities. The scope of the program covers all the basic principles and techniques of medication administration including an overview of common drugs, their effects and side effects, and key safety issues that include medication interactions, common errors, over-the-counter medications, and medication use in older adults.

This program will be delivered as 40 hours of theory in the classroom setting and 40 hours of clinical at an approved clinical facility.
