<u>Step 1</u>: Review this informational packet and the website for information on the PN to RN Bridge Program.

<u>Step 4</u>: Register for and take the NACE test. Score > 68% required for review of application.

<u>Step 5</u>: Submit a current New Hampshire or Vermont Practical Nurse License.



Core liberal arts courses must have a grade of "C" or higher from an accredited institution in order to transfer.

All core liberal arts classes should be < 10 years old.


PN to RN Bridge Application Process

Preferred Deadline November 30

Applications will be reviewed until all seats are full or February 15st.

Applicants will be notified by March 1st of acceptance.





ASN-RN Requirements



Accepted students will be required to complete the following within specific deadlines.


- 1. Criminal Background Record A NH and federal criminal background record. A history of a felony or selective misdemeanors may deny entrance into the nursing program.
- Drug Testing Drug testing is required prior to the start of any work-based clinical learning experience.
- 3. American Heart Association Basic Life Support (BLS) for Healthcare Providers.
- 4. Medical Documentation Physical exam and required vaccinations including the Covid Vaccine, booster and Flu vaccine.
- 5. Proof of Medical Insurance Students are required to carry medical insurance to participate in clinical.



Frequently Asked Questions

If I am testing virtually, what does my testing space need to look like? SECURITY

Virtual testing should mimic what it would be like if testing in a testing center.

- You must be alone in a secure area with no other individuals or distractions in the testing area.
- You must be at a desk or table with a chair.
- You may only have ONE monitor connected to your computer during the exam session. You may not begin the exam until all other screens have been disconnected and removed from your testing space.
- No food or beverages are allowed in the testing area at any time.
- The testing area must be silent with no other background noise.
- Speaking aloud during your test is not permitted in order to maintain fairness and consistency with in-person testing conditions.

Do I need to have a government-issued photo ID when I arrive at my appointment? TAKING THE TEST

Yes, whether you are testing virtually or onsite, you must present a government-issued photo ID that matches the name used during exam registration.

What approved materials am I allowed to have with me during virtual testing? TAKING THE TEST

You are permitted to use a basic four-function calculator and a dry-erase board, along with a marker and eraser. Paper and pen/pencil are **not** permitted. Additional details can be found on our student resource page.

How do I reschedule my VIRTUAL exam? GENERAL

If you need to reschedule your virtual exam session, you must do so at least 24 hours in advance. Failure to do so will result in a \$30 rescheduling fee. To reschedule, please create a support ticket with Proctor360.
